## **Replacement of the Cathedral Stairs**

Replacement of the front stairs is scheduled to begin the first part of July 2023. This will be an enormous undertaking and will cause some inconvenience to our parishioners.

- The front steps and the elevator will be unavailable for use during the entire project.
- The only entrance to the Cathedral will be the stairs located on the East and West side of the building.
- The restrooms will be closed off, however there is one available near the day chapel.
- The Parish Hall will be closed—coffee hour will be held outside on the lawn.
- The only access to the choir loft will be via the stairs.
- For those who cannot use the stairs the chair located at the entrance to the day chapel will be the only handicap access.

The question as to ADA access during construction is answered: The ADA does not apply to religious organizations and private clubs.

On July 22 we celebrate St. Mary Magdalene who Pope Francis elevated her memory to the status of Festivity on July 22, 2016 in order to stress the importance of this faithful disciple of Christ. In Luke 8:1-2 she is described as being a women who had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities and became an avid follower of Christ. In the gospel of Mark 15:40 it states that she was present at the crucifixion and in Mark 15:47 Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Jesus saw where he was laid. Mark 16: tells of Mary Magdalene and Mary the

mother of James going to the tomb with spices so that they could anoint Jesus but found the tomb empty. Chapter 16:9 tells us "Now when he rose early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, from whom he had cast out seven demons."

Bishop Fulton Sheen had this to say: Only purity and sinlessness could welcome the all holy Son of God into the world; hence, Mary Immaculate met him at the door of the earth in the city of Bethlehem. But only a repentant sinner, who had herself risen from the grave of sin to the newness of life in God, could fittingly understand the triumph over sin. To the honor of womanhood, it must forever be said: A woman was closest to the cross on Good Friday and first at the tomb on Easter Morn.
