Religious Education



On April 30th we celebrate the feast day of Pope Pius V. Antonio Ghislieri was born on January 17, 1504 and died on 1 May 1572. At the age of fourteen he entered the Dominican Order, taking the name Michele and was ordained a priest in 1528.

As a cardinal he had a reputation for putting adherence to acceptance of doctrines defined by creeds and ecumenical councils above personalities. He prosecuted eight French bishops for heresy, excommunicated Elizabeth I for heresy and persecution of English Catholic during her reign. He did not believe in nepotism, and rebuked his predecessor, Pope Pius IV when he wanted to make a 13-year-old member of his family a cardinal and subsidize a nephew from the papal treasury.

During his time as Pope, he had to deal with internal reform of the church and the spread of Protestant doctrines in the West and Turkish armies advancing from the East. He made many changes within the church and asserted the importance of the ceremonial in general and the liturgy of the Mass in particular.

Pope Pius V standardized the Mass by promulgating the 1570 edition of the Roman Missal. He made this mandatory throughout the Latin Church, except for Mass liturgy dating prior to 1370 for those places and congregations whose distinct rite could demonstrate an antiquity of 200 years or more.

Pope Pius V Helped in the construction of Valletta, Malta's capital city. He ordered the construction of public works to improve the water supply and sewer system of the city of Rome to help stop the spread of typhoid and malaria as they were inevitable summer visitors.

Cardinal John Henry Newman summed it up: "St. Pius was stern and severe, as far as a heart burning and melted with divine love could be so...Yet such energy and vigor as his were necessary for the times. He was a soldier of Christ in a time of insurrection and rebellion, when in a spiritual sense, martial law as proclaimed." (source Wikipedia)

MINISTRIES AND ROLES WITHIN THE MASS

The significance of Baptism is so much more than simply taking away original sin and allowing us to participate in the celebration of the Eucharist. The second Vatican Council tells us that participation in the liturgy is the **right and duty** of all the baptized. Some who are Baptized are called to be priests and are privileged to preside over the sacred mysteries, explaining God's Word and feeding God's people on the body and blood of Christ. It is important to understand that the celebration of the liturgy is **not** just the responsibility of the pastor, **pastors need the help** of their people, the ones who are serious about living out their baptismal right and responsibility to worship.

We as the laity need to understand that part of our duty to the liturgy is to accept some responsibility for the liturgy. **How can we the laity do that? There are many ways we can participate in the liturgy: acolytes, altar servers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, choir members, lectors, sacristans, and ushers.**
