Sunday November 24 we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King signifying the end of the liturgical year and the beginning of Advent.

The Feast of Christ the King was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI in his encyclical Quas primas to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. (Isaiah 9:6) (John 18:36-37)

Today, religious freedom for many people means that we can believe whatever we want in private, but when we are out in public we may not speak of anything that relates to our faith. This solemnity encourages us to celebrate and live out our faith in public.

We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the entire universe. (USCCB)
