Pilgrims of Hope Jubilee 2025

The Four Figures: The four stylized figures, represent all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity that should unite all peoples. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross, a sign of not only faith but also of hope, which can never be

abandoned, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need.

The Rough Waves and Anchor: It is helpful to observe the rough waves underneath; this indicates that life's pilgrimage does not always move in calm waters. Life's circumstances and the events of the world often demand a greater call to hope and because we see that the lower part of the cross has been turned into an anchor which stands out in the wave. As is well known, the anchor has often been used as a metaphor of hope. In maritime jargon the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency maneuvers to stabilize the ship during storms. It is worth noting that the image illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking but, rather, as something communal, marked by and increasing dynamism leading one ever closer to the cross.

The Cross: The cross in the logo is also dynamic. It bends down towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. Finally, the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year: Pilgrims in Hope.



The weekend of February 8th and 9th, Fr. John Jamnicky, a Cross Catholic Outreach volunteer will be celebrating Mass for our Parish and Missions. Fr. Jamnicky is a retired priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago, ordained in 1972 and was a pastor at St. Martin Church and School in the Englewood community on Chicago's south side and St. Raphael the

Archangel in Old Mill Creek, IL. For 18 years he served as the senior Catholic airport chaplain in the U.S. and administrator and Catholic chaplain of the O'Hare Airport Chapel at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport.

Fr. Jamnicky assumed the position of National Coordinator for Human Mobility Apostolates and the National Director of the Apostleship of the Seas at the USCCB in Washington, D.C., which encompassed the care of U.S. airport chaplains, and all ministries relating to land transportation. In 2006, he returned to Chicago to found St. Raphael the Archangel in Old Mill Creek, IL. Please welcome Fr. John to our wonderful parish.
