Religious Education



On Tuesday February 11 we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. In 1858 a 13year girl (Bernadette Soubirous) was collecting wood near the Massabielle grotto when she heard noise like a gust of wind coming from the grotto. As she looked toward where the sound was coming from, she saw a golden light and a beautiful lady. This was the first of 18 apparitions, from February 11th to July 16, 1858.

When Bernadette first saw the beautiful lady in the grotto the lady immediately smiled at Bernadette and signaled her to come closer. Bernadette took out her rosary and knelt to pray. As she started to make the sign of the cross her arm would not move, until the Lady made the sign of the cross only then was Bernadette able to do so.

On February 20, 1858 Our Lady gave Bernadette a prayer that she said everyday for the rest of her life. She never revealed the prayer to anyone but always brought a lighted candle with her. On March 25, 1858 when Our Lady appeared she called herself the "Immaculate Conception".

The Lady instructed Bernadette to drink water from a spring which was to appear inside the grotto and wash herself with it. She was also instructed to go to the local priest and ask to have a church built on the site. The message of Lourdes can be heard as "God is love and He loves us as we are."

After the apparitions' public interest grew, and curious visitors began to be replaced by pilgrims drawn by stories of apparitions and miracles.

Bernadette died on April 16,1879 at the age of 34. On September 22, 1909 her body was exhumed and found completely intact. On April 3, 1919 her body was again exhumed and found in the same state as it was ten years earlier. She was canonized a saint on December 9, 1933 by Pope Pius XI.
