St. Scholastica

The Feast of St. Scholastica, celebrated on February 10, honors the sister of St. Benedict and a woman of deep prayer and faith. From an early age, Scholastica dedicated her life to God and shared her brother's love for a life centered on prayer, community, and service. Tradition tells us that her trust in God and power of prayer was so strong that God answered her prayer for more time in holy

conversation with her brother. St. Scholastica reminds us that prayer flows from love and that our relationship with God should shape every part of our lives.

The Feast of St. Valentine, celebrated on February 14, honors a Christian martyr whose life was marked by faith, courage, and self-giving love. While little is known with certainty about St. Valentine, he is remembered as a priest who remained faithful to Christ even unto death.
