Second Sunday of Easter – Divine Mercy Sunday

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the great gift of **Divine Mercy** — a reminder that the Resurrection of Jesus is not only a victory over death, but a profound

outpouring of God's mercy upon the world.

In the Gospel, we encounter the risen Christ appearing to His disciples. He greets them with the words, "Peace be with you," and breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, instituting the Sacrament of Reconciliation: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them." In this moment, we see that the mercy of God is not abstract — it is personal, healing, and entrusted to the Church.

We also hear the story of Saint Thomas the Apostle, who struggles to believe in the Resurrection. Yet Jesus meets him in his doubt, inviting him to see and touch His wounds. Thomas responds with a beautiful profession of faith: "My Lord and my God!" This encounter reminds us that even in our doubts, Christ comes to us with patience and mercy. This Sunday was established as Divine Mercy Sunday by Pope John Paul II, inspired by the visions of Saint Faustina Kowalska. Through her, Jesus revealed the depth of His mercy and His desire that all people trust in Him. The simple prayer, "Jesus, I trust in You," has become a powerful expression of this devotion.

Divine Mercy Sunday invites each of us to both receive and share God's mercy. We are called to approach the Lord with trust, especially through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and to extend that same mercy to others in our daily lives. As we continue to celebrate the joy of Easter, may we open our hearts to the endless mercy of God and allow it to transform us. For it is in His mercy that we find peace, healing, and new life.
