Next Knight's meeting will be Thursday, July 16th, 2026

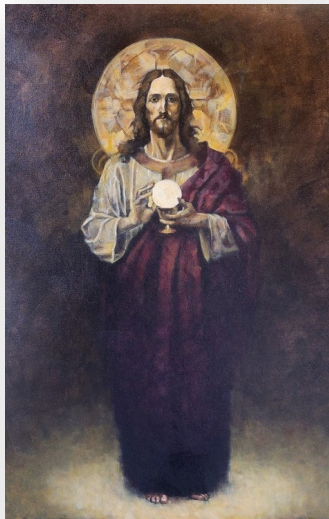

Saints Peter and Paul: Pillars of the Church

On June 29, the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, two of the greatest

apostles and pillars of the early Church. Though very different in background and personality, both men answered God's call and gave their lives in service to Christ and His Gospel.

Saint Peter, a humble fisherman from Galilee, was chosen by Jesus to lead His Church. Christ entrusted Peter with the "keys of the kingdom" and called him the rock upon which He would build His Church. Despite his human weaknesses, Peter remained faithful and became the first Pope, guiding the early Christian community.

Saint Paul, once a fierce persecutor of Christians, experienced a dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus. Transformed by God's grace, he became one of the Church's greatest missionaries, traveling throughout the Roman world proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ. His letters continue to inspire and instruct Christians today.

Tradition tells us that both Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome for their faith during the persecution of Christians under Emperor Nero. Their witness reminds us that following Christ requires courage, perseverance, and complete trust in God.

As we celebrate this solemnity, let us thank God for the faith handed down through the apostles and pray for the Church throughout the world. May the example of Saints Peter and Paul inspire us to remain steadfast in our faith and bold in sharing the Gospel with others.
