St. Mary Magdalene – Apostle to the Apostles

On July 22, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Mary Magdalene, one of the most faithful disciples of Jesus and the first witness to His Resurrection. Because the risen Christ entrusted her with announcing the Good News to the Apostles, the Church honors her

with the title "Apostle to the Apostles." The Gospels tell us that Jesus cast seven demons out of Mary Magdalene, transforming her life through His mercy and healing. From that time forward, she faithfully followed Him, accompanying Him throughout His ministry. She remained at the foot of the Cross during His Passion, witnessed His burial, and was among the first to visit His tomb on Easter morning. There, in her sorrow, Mary encountered the risen Lord. At first, she did not recognize Him, but when Jesus called her by name, she immediately knew it was Him. He then entrusted her with the joyful mission of proclaiming His Resurrection to the Apostles. Her response is a beautiful reminder that every disciple is called to encounter Christ personally and to share the Good News with others. St. Mary Magdalene's life is a powerful witness to the transforming power of God's mercy and the faithfulness of a heart devoted to Christ. She teaches us to remain steadfast in times of trial, to trust in the Lord's love, and to proclaim with joy that Christ is risen! As we celebrate her feast, may we open our hearts to the mercy of Christ and, like St. Mary Magdalene, faithfully share His love and the hope of the Resurrection with those around us. **St. Mary Magdalene, pray for us.**
