St. Alphonsus Liguori – A Shepherd of Mercy

On August 1, the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Alphonsus Liguori, Bishop, Doctor of the Church, and founder of the Redemptorists. He devoted his life to helping people know and love Jesus Christ, especially through preaching, moral theology, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. St. Alphonsus had a special love for those who struggled with sin and doubt. He reminded people that God's mercy is greater than our failures and encouraged them to approach the Sacrament of Confession with trust rather than fear. His writings and prayers continue to help Catholics grow in love for Christ. His life reminds us that holiness is not about never falling—it is about continually turning back to God. St. John Vianney – Patron of Parish Priests

The Transfiguration of the Lord – Listen to Him

On August 6, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, where He is transfigured before them and His divine glory shines forth. Moses and Elijah appear with Him, and the voice of the Father declares, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." The Transfiguration gives the disciples a glimpse of Christ's glory before they witness His Passion and Cross. It strengthens them for what lies ahead and reminds us that suffering and sacrifice are not the end of the Christian story. The glory of the Resurrection awaits. The Father's words—"Listen to Him"—are also meant for us. In the busyness of our lives, we can easily become distracted by many voices. The Lord calls us to make time for prayer, Scripture, and the Sacraments so that we can recognize His voice and follow Him more faithfully.
